

<u>Class Structures at Campbelltown Public School</u> <u>Information for Parents</u>

In our NSW Public School system, we are required to follow certain policies and procedures for the structure of classes and groupings. These policies and procedures are there to ensure we have the optimum ratio of teachers to students according to age and development. An example of this is that our kindergarten classes 'need not exceed' twenty students, our Year one & two classes 'need not exceed' 25 students, and all other classes 'need not exceed' 30 students.

Due to the policies and procedures, it is often necessary for us to combine students from different grades to form composite or multi-age classes.

At Campbelltown Public School, we have formed many composite classes this year and for many years previously for various reasons. The main reason is to distribute the number of students according to Department policies.

However, the second reason is that we find it provides more cohesive and harmonious classrooms for students if we ensure the best possible <u>social mix</u> in all our classes. To do this we combine students of the same stage of learning together. The stages of learning, as per the NSW Curriculum, are over two years (except for kindergarten) and are as follows:

Early Stage 1 - Kindergarten Stage 1 - Year 1 and Year 2 Stage 2 - Year 3 and Year 4 Stage 3 - Year 5 and Year 6

Very occasionally, we need to combine classes from two different stages. This is because we need to meet the number requirements in the lower grades; however, the mix is still based on social cohesion. <u>We have not structured our classes based on academic achievement, extension or remediation.</u>

<u>What does all this mean for your child</u>? Whether your child is in a regular grade class, a stage composite class or an across stage composite class their learning is expertly assessed and addressed by our teachers who cater for students as individuals within their class. Teachers are able to access curriculum from the full continuum of Early Stage 1 through to Stage 3 to fulfil learning needs of all students within their individual classrooms. Within each class, teachers are able to provide learning support and extension where required.
